Punctuality

Pease ensure that your child arrives at school between **8:40 to 8:50** ready for learning. After 9:00, children will be recorded as late receiving an 'unauthorised absence'. Please note that lessons start straight away in the morning with retrieval time and therefore your child will be missing valuable learning time if they arrive after the time stated.

Attendance

Please ensure that your child achieves a good attendance record (our school target is 97% ... this still would mean 4 weeks of missed school!) Try to avoid holidays within school time as this may affect your child's progress. Due to a recent change in the law, it is no longer possible for the Headteacher to authorise holidays during term time.

Uniform

Please make every effort to ensure that your child is wearing the correct Uniform and that it is clearly labelled. Children should wear completely black shoes — not trainers. P.E kits should only be worn on specified P.E days, which will change each half-term. Please note that children should not wear any form of jewellery (only stud earrings are allowed) and hairstyles and accessories must conform with school policy. No 'extremes' of hairstyles are allowed.

School Bags and Home School Diaries

We ask that your child only bring the schoolbook bag to school each day. Due to space restrictions in our classrooms, no large rucksacks will be permitted in school. Please ensure that your child also packs their Home/School Diary in their bag each day. These are an essential form of communication and also key to our approach to learning and independent study.

<u>Snack</u>

Children in years 1-6 can bring in their own healthy snack to eat at breaktime. This must not be chocolate, crisps or a sugary cereal bar. Water bottles are permitted but these must only be filled with water.

Reading at St James

Our approach to reading consists of weekly phonics (YR and KS1) or whole class reading lessons (KS2). In addition to this, we listen to children read whenever possible; have various interventions running throughout the year and have a text based English curriculum which means classes are sharing and enjoying books each and every day. Although we read whenever possible in school, it is still extremely important for parents to listen to their child read too— and to sign/ add comment to their Home/School diary.

A text message will also be sent home for all children reading 3 times per week as a thank you for supporting your child's reading. For those children reading 4 times or more a week for 10 consecutive weeks they will receive a prize.



Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse. (The Operation Encompass information is stored in line with all other confidential safeguarding and child protection information). The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

As a school we have ensured that we have members of our staff, (the Designated Safeguarding Lead and Deputy Designated Lead) known as Key Adults, who have been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing them to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care. We are aware that we must do nothing that puts the child/ren or the non-abusing adult at risk.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved. As a staff we have discussed how we can support our children who are experiencing Domestic Violence and Abuse on a day-to-day basis and particularly following an Operation Encompass notification. We use the Operation Encompass Key Adult Responsibilities checklist to ensure that all appropriate actions have been taken by the school.

Please be aware that if a child is absent from school after an Operation notification has been received then a home visit will take place.
