Solution Voting Details:

- Date of Election: Monday 15th September.
- Who Votes: All pupils in YI-Y6.

 across school (YI-Y6) will then cast a confidential vote for the candidate they believe will
 best represent the wider school community. Two Head Pupils and two deputy head pupils
 will be chosen and will be announced later in the week.

We encourage you to speak with your child about the qualities of good leadership and the importance of making thoughtful choices. These conversations at home help reinforce the values we promote in school and make the experience even more meaningful.









The elected Head Pupils will play a key role in representing the student body, supporting school events, and acting as role models throughout the year.
