Altitude	The vertical elevation of an object above a surface (such as sea level or land)
County	Land area divisions of the United Kingdom, used for the purposes of administrative, geographical and political boundaries.
Human Features	Man made features: buildings, houses,
Land Use	The management and modification of the natural environment.
Population	All the people living in a particular place.
Range	Series of mountains that are connected together generally to form a long line of mountains.
Rural	Relating to the countryside; far away from the town or city.
Settlements	The action of people coming together to live in an area.
Suburban	Refers to areas just beyond a city's border.
Urban	Relating to a town or city

Key knowledge

1. The UK is divided into section called counties. There are 48 counties in the UK. Our county is Merseyside.
2. Each county has its own council which is responsible for functions like education, sanitation and emergency services.
3. Mountains are areas of land that are much higher than the land surrounding them.
4. Mountains are higher, and usually steeper than a hil, and are generally over 600 metres high. The highest mountains in the UK are: Ben Nevis in Scotland, Scafell Pike in England, Slieve Donard in Northern Ireland and Snowdon in Wales
5. Mountains are often found together in a group called a mountain range.
6. Green Belt is an invisible line that goes around a certain area, stopping people from building there so that some of the wild and agricultural land can be saved.
7. Haydock is connected to Liverpool via the M6 motorway
8. The Port of Liverpool is one of the busiest ports in Britain and Northern Europe. Its main trade partner is North America, but its trade relationships are growing with ports in China, India, Africa, Australia, the Middle East, and South America.
