Key Vocabulary

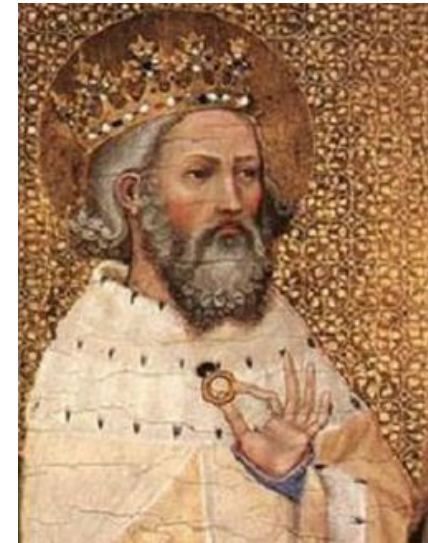
Pagan	A person holding religious beliefs that differ to main world religions.
Invaders	A person or group that enters a country or region.
Peasants	A person who is a farmer or labourer who owns limited land.
Outlaws	A person who has broken the law, especially one who remains at large.
Settlers	A person who moves with a group of others to live in a new country or area.
Anglo-Saxon	A term used for Germanic people who moved to and ruled areas that are today part of England and Wales.
Viking	A term used for Scandinavian seafaring pirate and traders who raided and settled in north-western Europe.
